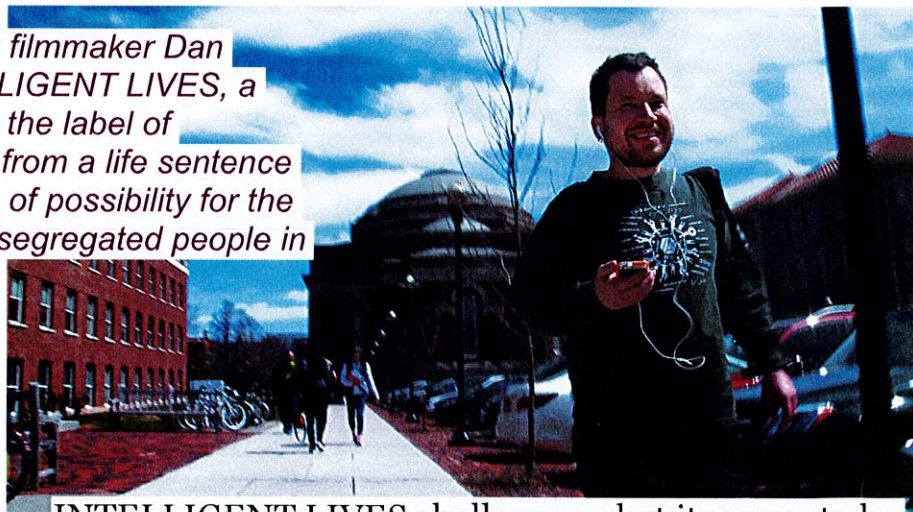


INTELLIGENT LIVES, THE FILM
